ASEAN centrality?

Mixed opportunities and challenges for ASEAN

- *Investment shift in the context of US-China decoupling;*
- International reputation after successful hosting of major events in 2022-2023 (ASEAN, APEC, G20, etc.);
- *Upgradation of some ASEAN+1 FTAs after RCEP.*

Promoting ASEAN centrality via:

- Making ASEAN integration more meaningful and relevant;
 - A better capacitated ASEAN Secretariat?
- Collaboration, rather than just "race to the bottom", in attracting foreign investment
 - Need support of external partners from GVC/RVC perspective;
- Fostering an ASEAN perspective of AMSs in various arrangements (CPTPP, RCEP)
 - IPEF, FTAAP?
- Platform for dialogues and works with superpowers on concrete initiatives beyond economic issues
 - Economic-security nexus.

An adaptive approach to de-risking

- Ensuring core economic benefits for all parties.
 - The case for regional FTA (e.g. RCEP and Australia-China?)
 - Engaging with foreign investors (e.g. experience from Viet Nam during COVID-19 pandemic).
- >Incubate new ideas for collaboration
 - Structural reform as important area for collaboration?
 - Concrete initiatives in relatively new areas (e.g. ASEAN Framework on CE, etc.)
- ➤ New role for think-tanks?
