



Tariffs on US-partner trade high/rising Tariffs elsewhere falling (Japan-EU, CPTPP, Canada-EU, etc)

"Reversal regionalism" around the US


Brexit as a tragic example

EU exit movements in rest of Europe were extinguished.


UK actually is pro-free trade, proglobalisation – just objects to Single Market loss of sovereignty.

India & China account for much of the reversal of GVC trade intensity




Service trade is growing fast





Service & intangibles trade is underestimated




'Intangibles' are more important

Corporate investment in intangible assets now exceeds investment in physical assets.



Data flows are booming





Data flows are changing fast


Service & professional jobs - not just factory jobs


