Basic Problems 1

- 1. "Slowness" and "Narrowness" of the Doha Round
- 2. Weak decision-making system

Consensus

Single Undertaking

- + Many upcoming issues
- →The dispute settlement system of the WTO cannot be sustainable without appropriate legislative functions.

Basic Problems 2

3. Challenge from FTAs

FTAs have become the focal point of liberalization and rulemaking.

- → Development of polarization
- Concerns on the emergence of "Spaghetti Bowls" of "rules"
- 4. Inability to deal with emerging needs and those for the industries and global supply chains.
 - →Industries have lost interest in the Doha Round / WTO.

Directions For Reform 1

- 1. Meeting emerging needs
 - → Further collaborations with the Industries
- 2. Meeting the demand for "variable geometry"
 - →Improving procedures for plurilateral agreements
 - → Making use of issue—based plurilateral agreements
 - →Introducing further "schedule of concessions" as in GATS
- 3. Dealing with the needs of developing members
- 4. Reforming the decision-making mechanism

Directions For Reform 2

- 5. Realizing tangible results quickly to restore confidence in the WTO
- 6. Multilateralization of FTAs/RTAs + Regionalization of WTO rules
- 7. Fight against protectionism
