







### And Half the Country Believes They Were Better Off Four Years Ago





% of registered voters who say each is **very important** to their vote in the 2024 presidential election












Support for More Rule by Executive Order and by Trump Supporters For Going After Political Opponents and Firing Government Workers





On the whole, would you say that you are satisfied or dissatisfied with the position of the United States in the world today?







- Yes, the West does not have the industrial capacity to protect itself while also supplying the Ukrainian war effort.



# Do Americans sympathize more with the Israelis, the Palestinians, or both about equally?


Do your sympathies lie more with ...? (% of U.S. adults)



Do you think free trade agreements with other countries generally increase or decrease...


















# Going Back to 1952, Polls Have Been Twice As Likely to Overestimate the Democratic Vote Margin in Presidential Elections

#### Polling errors in U.S. presidential elections

Bars represent average signed error



Note: The average signed error is the difference between the actual margin separating the candidates in the general election and the average margin in the polls. A negative error means that the Republican candidate's margin was overstated and a positive error means the Democratic candidate's margin was overstated.








# Sharp divide in voters' views of whether Harris and Trump will concede if they lose the election

If Harris wins, Trump will accept the results and publicly acknowledge that Harris won





#### FIGURE 16. Support for Political Violence Over Time, by Party Affiliation


