



### A cause of trade wars: income inequality

"We find that rising import competition was a robust positive contributor to Republican vote gains.


A counterfactual exercise indicates that the Democrat candidate would have won the states of Michigan, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania and North Carolina—resulting in a majority of votes in the electoral college— if the growth of import competition from China had only been half as large as actually observed."






